

# Is it really "NEVER AGAIN"?

Or...Does History Repeat Itself?









#### Exploit Crises, Frustrations & Fear

Take people's pain, uncertainty, and anger ... and then reframe it as a national crisis or grievance.

Fuel the narrative: "You're struggling, and it's someone else's fault."





### **©** Step 2:

#### Find Someone to Blame ... Then Dehumanise

- Target a vulnerable group.
- Turn individual actions into group stereotypes.
- Fuel conspiracy theories.
- Claim it's about protection:
   Protect the children. Protect women. Protect
   your culture. Your job. Your faith. Your country.
- Create fear. Then offer yourself as the "solution."






### Step 3:

#### Start the Purge...Quietly at First

- Once fear has taken hold, start tightening the grip.
- Shrink civic space.
- Attack freedom of expression, association, and assembly.







Criminalise Identity.

Dismantle Protection.

Erase Existence.

The goal becomes simple: **make people disappear.** 





# Criminalise Who People *Are*

- Ban or restrict identities through laws and policy.
- Use imprisonment, torture, or killing to intimidate and suppress.





### Attack the Protectors


- Target NGOs, activists, and journalists.
- Cut funding for human rights organisations.
- Demonise their work. Call them "foreign agents" or "traitors" or "enemies of the state."
- Make expressions of solidarity dangerous.





### © Create a Hostile Environment

- Enact laws that make LGBTQI, Roma, or migrant lives unliveable.
- Make everyday life unsafe people feel watched, targeted, unwelcome.
- Youth are forced to hide, unable to come out, connect, or grow.
- Isolation deepens help, friendship, communities and support vanish.





# Migration. Erasure.

- If you can't break them down, push them out.
- Society grows colder, harsher, more violent.
- The message is clear: You don't belong here.
- People start to think: "Maybe I need to leave."
- But even leaving feels unsafe hate is spreading everywhere.





# What's Happening Today?

### Populist Rhetoric on the Rise


- Leaders stoking fear and anger.
- Minorities blamed for national problems.
- Hate becoming a political strategy.





### Rise of the Right


- Nationalism, purity, "traditional values."
- Religion becomes a weapon.
- Harsh rules around masculinity, femininity, and gender roles.
- LGBTQI people, migrants, Roma painted as "threats" to the nation.





# This Isn't the Fringe Anymore

- Racial supremacy.
- Replacement theory.
- Antisemitism, anti-refugee, anti-LGBTQI rhetoric — mainstreamed.
- Hate speech floods social media.
- Algorithms amplify it. Adults ignore it.





# The Attack is Organised


- Cut funding for support organisations.
- Demonise human rights work as conspiratorial, "foreign," or treasonous.
- Undermine solidarity by making diversity itself the enemy.






# It Doesn't Stop with One Group

- Authoritarian movements don't stop at one target.
- They come for everyone who doesn't fit their idea of the "ideal citizen." Anyone seen as "undesirable".


